Regular Meeting on August 21, 2019

Councilman Daski moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on August 21, 2019; seconded by Councilman Smith. The motion carried unanimously (6).

7. PUBLIC HEARINGS / ORDINANCES / RESOLUTIONS

A. Public Hearing: Fiscal Year 2020 General Administrative Budget and Millage Rate

Chairman Price noted that the Fiscal Year 2020 General Administrative Budget was formulated using a millage rate of 6.10, which had not been modified since the City Council Budget Workshop on July 31, 2019.

At this time, Chairman Price declared the matter open to the public for comment. There being no public comment, Chairman Price declared the public hearing to be closed.

B. Public Hearing: Resolution Establishing Recomputed Proposed Millage Rate

City Attorney Miniclier read aloud the Resolution utilizing a millage rate of 6.10. Chairman Price then declared the matter to be open to the public for comment. There being no public comment, Chairman Price declared the public hearing to be closed.

11. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. Action Item: Proposed City Council Meeting Schedule for Calendar Year 2020 (Office of the City Clerk)

The City Clerk indicated that Ordinance No. 1608-2012 requires that, by December 31 of each year, City Council must adopt a schedule of regular meetings for the following calendar year. Typically, City Council meets on the first and third (or only the third in some instances) Wednesdays of the month. Because of required budget and TRIM-related advertising deadlines, the meetings for September had to be shifted to the second and fourth Wednesdays (September 9 and September 23). If the proposed schedule is approved, a Resolution will be drafted for adoption by City Council at a subsequent meeting.

Councilman Forester moved to approve the proposed City Council meeting schedule for calendar year 2020 and to authorize staff to draft the requisite Resolution; seconded by Councilman Ferguson. The motion passed unanimously (6).

B. Action Item:

Request to Amend Section 2-16, Rockledge Code of Ordinances, Modifying the Qualifying Period for Elections (Office of the City Clerk)

The City Clerk explained that, with regard to elections and ballot information, Brevard County is required to provide a bilingual ballot by 2020. As a result of these new regulations, the Brevard County Supervisor of Elections Office will need to receive election information from municipalities no later than 78 days prior to the election. Because the City's qualifying period runs from the 77th day to the 67th day prior to the election, the City has been requested to modify its qualifying period in order to conform to the 78-day deadline. If the recommended change in qualifying dates is not approved, it will result in information arriving to the Supervisor of Elections Office 11 days late. If approved, the new period will still provide for the same 10-day time frame for qualifying. Staff is further recommending that any future changes to the qualifying period can be executed by Resolution.

Councilman Ferguson moved to approve the recommendation and amend Section 2-16(a), Rockledge Code of Ordinances, by modifying the qualifying period for elections; and further moved to permit any future changes to the qualifying period to be executed by Resolution; seconded by Councilman Smith. The motion passed by unanimous vote (6).

Ratification of Declaration of Emergency, Hurricane Dorian (City Manager)

City Manager Fettrow explained that, on August 28, 2019, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 19-198 declaring that a State of Emergency existed in every county in the State of Florida as a result of Hurricane Dorian. As prescribed in the minutes of the July 17, 2018, City Council meeting, the City Manager obtained verbal confirmation from all Council members to proceed with having the Mayor issue a Declaration of a Local State of Emergency. The purpose of this agenda item is to ratify the action that was taken. A Resolution memorializing same will be presented to Council for consideration at the September 18, 2019, meeting.

Councilman Forester moved to ratify the action taken to declare a local state of emergency and the action taken to close City administrative offices on September 3 and 4 to nonessential personnel and to provide for the employees' compensation; and to authorize staff to draft the requisite Resolution; seconded by Councilman Ferguson. The motion passed unanimously (6).

12. PETITIONS, REMONSTRANCES AND COMMUNICATIONS

Mike Cadore, 1311 Hideaway Lane, thanked Council members for their courtesy and professionalism during the storm and informed them that students from Rockledge High School would be helping to deliver meals to seniors in conjunction with Aging Matters on September 5.

13. REPORTS

- A. City Manager Report
 - City Manager Fettrow:
 - Reported that, at the August 21, 2019, City Council meeting, a Resolution was considered by Council. The Resolution, which was tabled by Council pending a meeting of the Canaveral Port commissioners, set forth that the Canaveral Port Authority would be required to invest a portion (2 percent) of its gross revenue in cleanup efforts for the Indian River Lagoon. On August 28, the Canaveral Port Authority convened, but the item was not on the agenda, and, while some remarks were made, no action was taken. State Representative Tyler Sirois, who is spearheading the effort, will be meeting individually with each Port commissioner.
 - Thanked Council members for their support during Hurricane Dorian and noted that the area dodged a major bullet.
- B. City Attorney Litigation Report
 - o None
- C. Reports from the Dias
 - Councilman Hartselle noted that he was pleased that Hurricane Dorian did not do extensive damage.
 - Councilman Smith reported that he will be out of town the week of September 8.
 - Councilman Ferguson:
 - Stated that, although the Space Coast dodged a bullet, the Bahamas unfortunately did not.
 - Expressed appreciation to the City Manager and staff for their efforts during the storm.
 - Invited all in attendance to a community gathering, Praise at the Hub, on September 14, 6:00 p.m., at the Civic Hub.
 - Reported that he and the City Manager attended a productive meeting on August 22 with State Senator Tom Wright; a meeting

with State Representative Tyler Sirois will take place in the near future.

o Councilman Daski:

- Commented that he had the honor of attending executive staff meetings at the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) during the storm event and that they were enlightening and informative.
- Expressed gratitude to staff for their efforts during Dorian.
- Reminded members of the 9/11 Ceremony on Wednesday,
 September 11, 6 p.m., at the Civic Hub.
- Noted that he will be out of town for a few days beginning on September 13.
- Councilman Forester indicated that he greatly appreciated the efforts of staff during the storm event.
- o Mayor Price noted that he was looking forward to the 9/11 Ceremony and informed Council that he would be delivering a State of the City address at Rockledge Presbyterian Church on September 14 at 9:00 a.m.
